

# Economic Driver & Inviting Destination



### **Torrington Cultural District**

KidsPlay is one of many cultural assets that are making a significant impact by drawing visitors downtown and improving the quality of life for area residents. The newly-designated Torrington Cultural District is recognized for its tourism, business development, and entertainment opportunities. Torrington was the second city in Connecticut to receive a Cultural District designation. Museum Director, Eileen Marriott, participated in the application process and served as Co-Chair of Torrington's Cultural District Committee.



#### CT Summer at the Museum

This statewide initiative promotes informal learning and summer enrichment. The Museum joined for a second year in 2022 providing 5,500+ free admissions to Connecticut's children and their caregivers. Many were first-time visitors discovering our Museum and downtown Torrington.




#### Town-Hall Style Meeting with Governor and Chamber of Commerce




## 2022 KidsPlay by the Numbers




#### Visitors by Town

Educational

In its second year, KidsPlay hosted two sessions of its summer camp for English language learners. KidsPlay camp staff provided unique opportunities for the rising 1st and 2nd graders from the Torrington Public Schools to engage in hands-on STEM learning, literacy-based imaginative play, and community exploration.

KidsPlay collaborated with community partners to introduce campers to local cultural resources. They toured and engaged with the vibrant arts and culture gems that make our community so special.

### Spooky Science

KidsPlay celebrated National Chemistry Week in
October with this "spooky" event sponsored by Dymax
Corporation. Volunteers from Dymax introduced
children to fundamental STEM learning concepts
through hands-on experiments that included making
bubbling baking soda and vinegar "witches' brews",
spooky full moon chromatography, bizarre handmade
bouncing balls, and much more!



# Best Summer Ever

Ultimate Exploration "Best Summer Ever" offered playful summer enrichment with special programs, events, and exhibit enhancements.

### STEM Club

Children investigated how STEM concepts shape the world around them at STEM Club. KidsPlay's STEM Specialist, Donna Maraia facilitated activities like making casts of fingerprints or exploring acids and bases through common beverages. Kids discovered that science is more than a subject in school - it's a part of their everyday lives.



This physics-themed event encouraged parent-child teams to engineer mini-catapults and then fling pumpkins across the parking lot using a catapult built by our exhibits team. It was minimally destructive and maximally educational fun! Other pumpkin-based activities included dissection, ring toss, bowling, and painting.





# Cultural Gateway

#### **Strategic Priority**

Infuse diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility (DEIA) into all areas of operation



### **Ruby Bridges**

Effie shared the story of Ruby Bridges, one of the first black students to integrate into the white school system in New Orleans in 1960 and became a powerful example of how children can make a difference.



### **African Drumming**

Angaza led several African Drumming programs, inviting children and parents to join him in playing different types of drums while learning about these instruments' cultural and historical importance.

In 2022, we worked with our community partners to co-create engaging, educational, respectful, and fun programs that explored our community's racial, cultural, and educational diversity.

#### Storytelling with Our Culture is Beautiful

Effie and Angaza Mwando co-founded Our Culture is Beautiful to celebrate culture and bring people together. At KidsPlay they used song, drumming, improvisation and dramatic storytelling to share important stories.

#### **Unsung Heroes of Flight**

Effie highlighted amazing women of aviation who made space travel happen. She shared true stories about early pilots, scientists, mathematicians and engineers including Harriet Quimby, Bessie Coleman, Hilda Hewlett, and Edith Berg.









#### Sensory Friendly Playtime

What's fun for one child can be very upsetting for another. This is especially true for children with sensory disorders and learning differences, and it can be difficult for families to find safe and inclusive places for their children to play, learn, and socialize. In recognition of this, KidsPlay hosts a Sensory Friendly Playtime, where reduced Museum capacity and various sensory accommodations make it easier for children and families to meaningfully engage in playful learning. Sensory Friendly Playtime is generously sponsored by the Union Savings Bank Foundation.

### **Indigenous Lifeways and History**

Darlene Kascak of the Institute for American Indian Studies (IAIS) led several programs at KidsPlay to share Indigenous lifeways and history. Topics included the role of oral storytelling in native cultures, innovative "technologies" of the past that helped communities adapt to changing environments and the relevance of the talking stick. The programs often included tactile resources and artifacts.





#### Art Adventures - Native Voices

How do we explore art and difficult subjects in a way that is safe and age-appropriate? This year's Art Adventure focused on the Native Voices exhibit at Five Points Gallery. The powerful exhibit used stunning portraits to highlight the epidemic of missing and murdered indigenous women (MMIW). Patty Cassella, KidsPlay's Learning Experience Specialist, worked together with the gallery to help children understand the art using the theme of identity. This lens puts emphasis on the power of art to tell stories. Children shared their interpretations of the work on display. Afterward, they were given mirrors and art supplies to create a self-portrait and choose how they want to represent themselves. Programs like Art Adventure give children the tools to understand and enjoy art more fully as they grow.

### Explore the World with "Play"

KidsPlay was selected by the Association of Children's Museum (ACM) to host "Play," a prototype from the Freeman Foundation Asian Culture Exhibit Series (FFACES). The exhibit is designed for children and families to promote different types of play and highlight cultural elements of South Korea, China, and Japan.

Children learned about Korea's Haenyo divers and the abundance of seafood as they crawled through the ocean tunnel and explored a replica of Busan's Jagalchi Fish Market. They cared for pandas in the panda sanctuary and sold candied hawthorn berries and scallion pancakes from traditional Chinese street food carts. They also discovered the art of Japanese Kigumi, or the art of joining wood together without nails or screws.

#### Dance Around the World

Presented in collaboration with Our Culture
Is Beautiful and as part of the fifth annual
Make Music NWCT Celebration hosted by
the NWCT Arts Council, Dance Around the
World displayed what community
partnerships can make happen! With 128
attendees and performances by eight groups,
including an international dance group from
Torrington High School and a student
performance by the Nutmeg Ballet
Conservatory, this event used the best of
what Torrington has to offer to teach
children how people move, dance, and play
all around the world.











#### **Community Conversations**

KidsPlay invited members of the local Latine community to discuss how KidsPlay can celebrate and appreciate Hispanic culture and to serve the community better. These conversations led to the creation of the Hispanic Heritage Month programs, a bilingual reading corner, and several other events throughout the year.

### Latin American Mother's Day Celebration

Mother's Day is celebrated in many places around the world! This program focused on Mother's Day traditions from Mexico, Honduras, Colombia, Ecuador, the Dominican Republic, and Argentina. Children learned about these traditions and made beautiful craft bouquets inspired the national flower from these countries.









To celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month in September, KidsPlay designed a 5-week program series for children and families to learn about different countries and cultures across Latin America. Children and caregivers enjoyed a cozy bilingual reading corner in the North Gallery Program Room.

Programs included making Frida Khalo paper flower crowns, weaving God's eyes, and making Guatemalan Worry Dolls.

To close out the month, KidsPlay partnered with New Opportunities to co-host Dance Across Latin America, a showcase of local youth dance groups who demonstrated different dance styles across the Americas.



# **Community Resource**

#### Birth to Graduation

Birth to Graduation helps families to spend quality time together while teaching caregivers how to best serve their children's developmental needs. With translation services available for Spanish-speaking families and early intervention options for children with learning differences, this program helps to empower families to use the network of available community resources in Torrington. In 2022, over 40 families with 70 children participated in B2G programs at KidsPlay!

### Community Family Learning Center

The Community Family Learning Center (CFLC) is a Torrington Public Schools family outreach project that includes a 1,800-volume Family Resource Library at KidsPlay.

Paula Gajewski is a certified K-6 teacher and library media specialist who oversees the CFLC and uses her time at the KidsPlay to foster positive relationships with current and future Torrington Public Schools families. The CFLC provides resources and support to proactively address students' needs and ensure their academic success.

### Celebrate "Kids" and "Belonging"

When the Celebrate Belonging in Your Community event was rained out, KidsPlay opened its galleries to the B.E.R.E.A.D.Y. Project for a modified event, "Celebrate Kids." The Museum welcomed 125 people to play and meet organizations providing resources for families. A month later, The B.E.R.E.A.D.Y. Project, with sponsorship from the Charlotte Hungerford Hospital, hosted their all-ages event on Main Street. It included food, music, and activities that embrace diversity, equity, and inclusion. The Museum was open for play and provided community art projects and collaborative family games.














### Art is Everywhere! Bilingual Stories in the Meadow




# Our 2022 Financial Story



#### **Strategic Priority**

Be a responsible steward of earned income and philanthropic investments through the development and implementation of appropriate financial controls, oversight, and strategic investment policies.



#### A Legacy Investment

KidsPlay was grateful to receive its first bequest from a longtime member of the Board of Directors, Valerie Defeo Vitalo. Val taught at Torrington Public Schools for 38 years and had deep ties to the local arts community. She understood that the sustainability of the Museum's work was essential to its long-term impact. Val was instrumental in establishing the Museum's Legacy Circle to recognize individuals who included KidsPlay in their estate plan. She knew firsthand that some donors might be able to make a greater financial impact with a legacy gift than through donations during their lifetime.

Thank you to the 400+ individuals, 50+ businesses, 10+ foundations, & Federal, State, and City funds that supported our work in 2022!

#### State of Connecticut

In Connecticut's 2022 - 2023 Biennial Budget, the Legislature recognized that children's museums across Connecticut were disproportionately affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic and designated special Directed Local Funds for children's museums through the Department of Economic and Community Development (DECD). KidsPlay received \$180,000 in both 2021 and 2022. This program was administered by the Office of the Arts.

KidsPlay also benefited from the State's sector-wide support through the CT Cultural Fund (\$5,000) and the CT Summer at the Museum program (\$66,560). These State investments were administered by the Connecticut Humanities Council (CT Humanities).

#### A Museum for the Community

Ensuring all families are welcomed and feel a sense of belonging is part of KidsPlay's broad commitment to diversity, equity, access, and inclusion. The Museum for the Community Initiative, a multifaceted accessibility program, expanded in 2022 with grants from the Union Savings Bank Foundation (Sensory Friendly Playtime), and the Thomaston Savings Bank Foundation (Agency Memberships), along with contributions to the Community Fund from many donors.

# Notable Investments

#### **Northwest Corner Gives**

42 donors reinvigorated the Museum's expansion effort!
The Northwest Connecticut Community Foundation organized and matched donations for this crowdfunding campaign helping KidsPlay raise \$53,710, or 107% of the goal. These funds are being used to rebuild the space within 57 Main Street into new exhibit galleries and the Hub@KidsPlay. This project increases the museum's capacity and its collective impact on children and families.





#### **Literacy Tree House**

The Museum's Literacy Tree House has been a beloved signature exhibit since 2015. Despite its sophistication, it lacked the artwork and design elements first envisioned.

As the Museum's exhibit efforts progressed, an opportunity to highlight STEM more thoroughly in the tree house was also identified. In early 2022, Board Member Val Vitalo and Museum Advocate Elaine Murphy launched a plan and a fundraising campaign to complete the Literacy Tree House and refresh worn elements. These efforts included a grant from the Northwest Connecticut Community Foundation's Miriam Mason Cable Trust Fund, a Back to School Cut-A-Thon, and more. When Val Vitalo passed away, the gifts made in her memory were designated to complete this project that was so meaningful to her.

#### **Strategic Priority**

Develop the diversified funding and communication strategies necessary to build organizational capacity and relationships.

#### Neighborhood Assistance Act Program

ConnectiCare, Dymax, Eversource, Santa Energy, The York Hill Trap Rock Quarry Company, and William P Ryan DMD invested \$69,000 into energy efficiency projects at the Museum. KidsPlay worked with these businesses to secure business tax credits for their donations through Connecticut's Neighborhood Assistance Act Program. Additional support for these projects was provided by Alliant and McKenna Orthodontics.

#### City of Torrington

A robust safety and security infrastructure is critical to protecting capital investments and providing a safe environment for families. The City of Torrington pledged \$74,270 of its American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) allocation to secure this infrastructure for KidsPlay's growing campus. This Community Impact Grant supplements the City's 2021 Facade Improvement grant for 57 Main Street. Together, these programs aim to make transformative investments to sustain and strengthen Torrington's economic recovery. KidsPlay's expansion of interactive exhibit galleries and program capacity from 11,000 sf to over 20,000 sf amplifies the Museum's reputation as an innovative tourist destination for families.



#### Give Local - Best Summer EVER

In April 2022, we raised money through the Connecticut Community Foundation's Give Local of Greater Waterbury and Litchfield Hills online giving campaign for 'KidsPlay's Best Summer EVER.' Thanks to all the donors who supported this effort, we reopened the Maker Space, added new exhibit elements, offered special programs, and participated in community events. It was the ultimate way to nourish the social, emotional, and cognitive wellbeing of children.
