



New Gallery (Partially) Opens at 57 Main Street

This much-anticipated gallery is now PARTIALLY open, turning a

once-underutilized building into a center for creativity and wonder. In 2019, KidsPlay purchased 57 Main Street from the Salvation Army to transform it into an interactive gallery and a community resource. Challenges posed by the global pandemic slowed progress, but the resilient spirit of KidsPlay prevailed. We are so grateful to local philanthropists and foundations whose unwavering support has

fueled this monumental expansion.



The timing of this partial opening couldn't be more perfect! In 2023, a record-breaking 57,000+ visitors flocked to the Museum, and the galleries couldn't comfortably meet demand on peak days. The new space was a game-changer during bustling winter weekends and vacations.

The work to fully complete and integrate this space into the Museum is moving at a good pace. In the coming months, the Hub@KidsPlay will open, including the Community Family Learning Center's Resource Library and a new program space accessible to community partners.

As funding and contractor schedules permit, work continues toward opening more exhibit space and introducing captivating STEM and trades-related exhibits. **Be ready for an immersive experience that engages young minds and the young at heart.**

Exhibit Spotlight: Polar Pond

This popular seasonal exhibit debuted last winter in KidsPlay's North Gallery, where children could slip and slide across **the sock-skating rink (made of synthetic ice), play with life-sized penguin plushies, and throw**

fluffy "snow" balls. In addition to encouraging imaginative play, the exhibit allows children to practice their balance and gross motor skills.

This year, Polar Pond is located in the newly opened South Gallery expansion. The bigger and better home for the exhibit allows for a larger rink and new fun winter-themed activities, like building structures out of "ice" blocks and snowman bowling.

Elaine has been instrumental in the fundraising for the Literacy Tree House ever since this world-class exhibit was just an idea. From 2014 to 2016, Elaine organized the "Magic of Childhood," an annual event to raise funds to build the tree house. In early 2022, when the exhibit was ready for an update, she and her friend Val Vitalo launched a second campaign to expand the exhibit's artistic and learning potential with botany, biology, and environmental science.

After Val passed away, Elaine worked with the staff, board, and fellow advocate, Marilyn Plaskiewcz, to dedicate the Story Nest in her Memory.


