

Role Description: Youth Summer Intern
Reports to: Youth Workforce Mentor

Essential Function

This paid internship is part of a structured program designed to support participants in their first job experience. Youth Summer Interns receive orientation, weekly cohort meetings, and ongoing mentorship from the Youth Workforce Mentor. Through hands-on roles that support museum visitors, programs, and operations, interns develop essential skills in communication, responsibility, teamwork, and leadership while contributing meaningfully to the museum environment.

Essential Duties

- Interact with visitors in ways that help all visitors feel welcomed and supported.
- Learn how exhibits work and help children and families explore them in a fun and safe way.
- Reset exhibits and help keep the Museum spaces clean, safe, and ready for play.
- Stay updated on the day's schedule and help where needed.
- Help with setup and cleanup and facilitation of programs and events.
- Assist with collecting feedback and surveys.
- Communicate visitor feedback and safety concerns to staff.
- Follow safety protocols and emergency procedures.
- Prepare and implement meaningful, short-term projects that support exhibits, programs, or visitor engagement.
- Shadow museum staff to learn about planning, collaboration, and logistics.
- Represent the museum with professionalism and enthusiasm.

Demeanor and Engagement

- Brings energy, enthusiasm, and a welcoming attitude to each shift.
- Treats others with patience and respect.
- Adapts well to new tasks and an ever-changing work environment.
- Demonstrates commitment to KidsPlay's mission and values.

- Active listening Pays attention, asks questions, and responds to others thoughtfully.

- Reflective Practice Sets personal goals and monitors progress.
- Professionalism Maintains a neat appearance and keeps workspaces tidy.
- <u>Reliable Communication</u> Responds promptly to messages regarding scheduling or assignments and notifies staff in advance if unable to attend.

Oualifications

- Successful results on a criminal and sexual abuse background screening.
- Must be at least 16 years of age at the time of employment
- Must be a current High School student at the junior or senior level
- Must have a GPA equivalent to a "B" average or higher

Physical Demands

Considerable standing, walking, stooping, and stair climbing. Some lifting of more than 20 lbs., bending, and stretching overhead is required. Use of ladders and tools and exposure to paints, glues and solvents. Exposure to body fluids (e.g. diapering equipment and the use of spill kits for vomit). Outdoor activities may expose this position to extremes in temperature and inclement weather.

Schedule expectations

Part-time position of 20 hours per week.

Due to museum hours, the Youth Summer Intern schedule includes evenings and weekends. The Youth Summer Intern position ends Labor Day, September 1, 2025. After this time a Youth Summer Intern would be eligible to apply for a Guest Service Assistant position.
