Director's Report

As we move into the second half of 2025, we want to share a few key updates that reflect both our growth and the challenges we continue to navigate.

This spring, we finished the much-needed roof replacement at 61 Main Street. This project was possible thanks to strong community support, including funding from local foundations, corporate partners, and last summer's crowdfunding campaign. The new roof safeguards our exhibits, building, and the children and families who rely on it.

Our work on the Hub@KidsPlay Initiative continues, though cautiously. A preliminary injunction temporarily restored the IMLS funding that was unexpectedly cut earlier this year. While we're grateful that this has allowed us to keep the initiative active, there remains uncertainty surrounding this funding. Despite these challenges, we've continued to strengthen community partnerships and advanced key goals.

In the first half of the year, visitation showed a positive trend, with KidsPlay hosting over 33,000 visits. We also reached the milestone of more than 450,000 total visits since opening in 2012.

Despite challenges and financial constraints, KidsPlay continues to move forward with purpose. We're grateful for the community support that makes this possible and remain committed to building joyful, inclusive learning experiences for all.



Exhibit Spotlight: Surf City

Surf's up at KidsPlay! Families can enjoy a "day at the beach" in this new seasonal exhibit. Children develop fine motor skills building sandcastles in our sand table, hone their balance on surfboards, and take part in collaborative imaginative play at a beachside campfire, a fishing boat, an ice cream stand, or an undersea tunnel. We all love fun in the sun - but this beach is ready for play even on a rainy day!



Seasonal exhibits like Surf City mean that there's always something new for families to explore at KidsPlay. Be sure to keep an eye on our new South Gallery to see what other new opportunities for play and learning are coming to KidsPlay!

From kinetic sand and treehouse adventures to beachside pretend play and grocery store shopping, every visit is full of laughter, creativity, and connection.

As Teen Librarian, Jill also hosted two "teen takeovers" at KidsPlay with the Torrington Library Teen Advisory Board. During these special afterhours events, teens enjoyed pizza and played in the exhibits - without needing to worry about bumping into smaller children while making Maker Space crafts or playing Museum-wide hide-and-seek.

Whether hosting teen events after hours or reconnecting with familiar faces like staff members Kristin and Ellie, Jill says KidsPlay is more than a museum: it's a community space where her family comes to learn, grow, and shine together.



The Hub Spotlight: Patricia Pepen, CJR Teacher of the Year



Patricia Pepen, a dedicated instructor with the Connecticut Junior Republic since 2011, was recently honored as Teacher of the Year for the 2024–2025 school year.

In addition to her work with at-risk youth in the justice system, she brings joy and energy to KidsPlay's Birth to Graduation playgroup as a bilingual volunteer. "Kids need motivation. They need happiness," Pepen says. "Everything I do, I do for them." Her passion and commitment continue to inspire those around her, especially the children whose lives she helps to brighten every day.

Over the past year, the Birth to Graduation program welcomed 69 children of program age, 23 siblings, and 93 parents and caregivers to 20 evenings of engaging early literacy, family bonding, and community support. Led by Community Coordinator Julie Fabiaschi, B2G is supported by many dedicated volunteers, including educators and community members.
